A word from meteorologist Jim Woodmencey on Cloud Cover Forecasts:

This is it....Eclipse happens today, and tomorrow I don't have to do this level of forecasting anymore! Yeah!

Make sure you check out the **Forecast Satellite** image I posted for noontime today MDT.

Out West: Other than the smoke, eastern Oregon looks good. High clouds moving away from NE Idaho under centerline. Wyoming gets that high cloud band from SW to NE across the state at noon.

Back East: Some of the best holes look to be over SE Missouri, Tennessee and parts of NW South Carolina.

In Wyoming.....That vast space between Riverton & Casper looks like the best. That band of clouds exits far western Wyoming early in the Eclipse, and shows up oer central Wyoming at the end of the Eclipse.

Over Jackson Hole: These narrow bands of high clouds will be moving off to the east & southeast Jackson Hole about the time the eclipse begins here. That still does put them in the direction the sun will be in the sky at start of Eclipse (130° to 135° on your compass). Most all of of these clouds will are high-level clouds, & well above the 14,000-ft. elevation.
